CRITERIA FOR PI GAMMA MU MEMBERSHIP**

Pi Gamma Mu is the largest social sciences honor society in the nation and **membership into the Lincoln University Alpha Lambda Graduate Chapter is based on a cumulative grade point average of 3.70 -- as well as completion of thirty graduate credit hours** in the social sciences. Other criteria for membership as mandated by the Master of Human Services program are as follows:

- MHS students must rank in the top 15% of their class academically;
- Applicants must submit a written statement outlining “Lifelong Learning and Educational Goals”;
- Applicants must agree to devote a portion of their time to the performance of community services; and
- Each applicant must agree to contribute to the advancement of the social science field through research, training, consultation, or professionalism.

To be eligible for the Alpha Lambda Graduate Chapter of Pi Gamma Mu, first and foremost, you must make certain that your cumulative grade point average in no less than 3.70! Additional information regarding membership will be forwarded to eligible applicants within the next few weeks. All applicants are reminded that induction into the Alpha Lambda Graduate Chapter of Pi Gamma Mu is based solely on the criteria outlined above.
