

# GREATER PHILADELPHIA SCHWEITZER FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The Greater Philadelphia Schweitzer Fellows Program (GPSFP) is a part of the National Schweitzer Fellowship Program and is seeking to build Leaders in Service who are dedicated to working with the underserved in their communities, through the fellowship year and beyond. The GPSFP is a one-year interdisciplinary fellowship program focused on community service and leadership development. Fellows design and implement their own 200-hour community service projects that address local unmet health needs and participate in monthly Fellowship activities and receive a \$2,000 stipend. The community service projects of Schweitzer Fellows should aim to provide direct service to an underserved population in the Greater Philadelphia area. The majority of the service hours are spent in direct contact with the population the fellow chooses to serve. Research, fundraising and policy-based projects are not considered appropriate Fellowship projects. Students enrolled in degree-granting programs in health and human service related fields such as medicine (non-residents or 3rd year students), nursing, public health, acupuncture, education, engineering, law, music, occupational and physical therapy, pharmacy, social work, public policy, and others are encouraged to apply. Each year we select a diverse group of students from multiple graduate schools. Students must be enrolled in degree-granting programs from April 2009 - April 2010. Applications must be submitted online by 5 pm on Sunday, February 1, 2009.
