MSA delivers:

- Competitive, rigorous theoretical, empirical, and applications-oriented bodies of knowledge in finance and human resources management disciplines.
- Knowledge, skills and abilities to strategically, competitively and collaboratively influence and leverage human capital, operational and financial assets of the enterprise.
- Entrepreneurial capability for idea creation, innovation and application in social, private and public enterprises.
- Research skills to analytically optimize and integrate course concepts and applications with career, occupational and post-graduate interests.

MSA entrance requirements:

- A cumulative undergraduate grade point average of **2.7** on a **4.0** scale or **3.0** for completed graduate-level course work.
- Copy of bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year undergraduate institution.
- Résumé of work experience and professional accomplishments.
- An optional Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and/or Miller Analogies Test.
- A 500-word essay describing past academic/career achievements, future career goals, and interest in the Finance and/or Human Resources Management concentration.
- Three letters of recommendation from professional and academic sources.
- An official academic undergraduate and/or graduate transcript.
- Interview with MSA Director and Director for Graduate Admissions and Student Services.
