

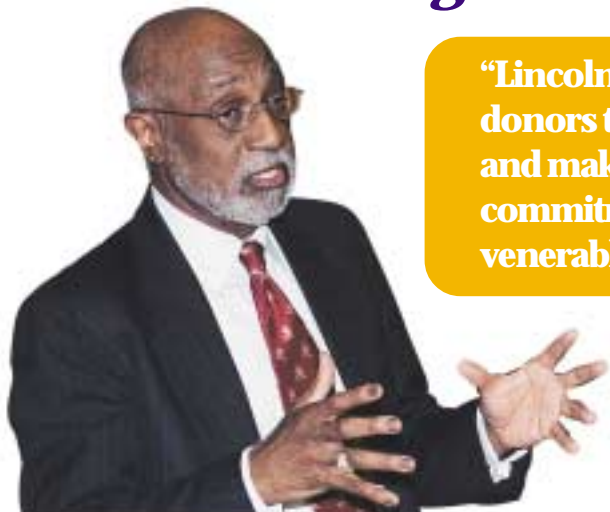

## University Prepares for Major Fund-Raising Campaign Alumni Encouraged to 'Step Up' Annual Contributions



**“Lincoln needs more alumni donors to step up to the plate and make significant commitments to this venerable institution.”**

**W**hen Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge visited Lincoln’s campus last December, he left behind a magnificent gift: a commitment by the state to provide an additional \$29.4 million to address the University’s critical need to enhance Lincoln’s deteriorating infrastructure.

The long-awaited announcement of funds for campus improvements also sent a signal to the University: the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was ready to provide significant financial support for Lincoln, which Gov. Ridge described as a “national treasure we must preserve and enhance.”

Earmarked over a three-year period, the state funds targeted nine campus improvement projects, including replacement of Lincoln’s telecommunications, electrical, boiler plant and steam distribution systems, and upgrading the water distribution system.

#### Campaign For Lincoln University

The governor’s commitment of \$29.4 million also signaled the start of the

“quiet” phase of Lincoln’s first major fund-raising campaign. Entitled ***Commitment to Excellence: The Campaign For Lincoln University***, the fund-raising campaign will enable us to strengthen our historic mission as America’s premier Historically Black University.

A successful campaign also will help us to remain true to our signature motto of *Producing Leaders to Shape a New Millennium*.

Lincoln, under the Office of Development and External Relations, is proactively proceeding with plans to design and implement a \$100-million capital fund drive for the University with specific emphasis on enhancing:

- Facilities and Equipment
- Technology
- Endowment Support
- Operating Support

Over the next months, you can expect to receive additional information about the campaign in the pages of the *Lincoln Lion* and *Lincoln Review*.

**A vital goal** of the campaign for this fiscal year, however, is to secure contributions from at least 1,200 alumni (see chart on page 7).

In effect, a strong showing of support from our alumni sets the stage for larger commitment from corporations, foundations and individuals.

Most all successful university fund-raising efforts are built on the foundation of a strong and supportive alumni-giving program.

## The Challenges Ahead

As the University works toward the initiation of a \$100-million campaign, the Office of Development and External Relations has set eight key performance objectives to be accomplished this fiscal year that ends June 30, 2002. They are:

1. Increase the University's contributed income to \$2 million by June 30, 2002.
2. Increase the number of alumni contributors from the 407 who gave last fiscal year to at least 1,200 (or 20%) by June 30, 2002.
3. Raise alumni contributions from \$201,926 donated last fiscal year to at least \$700,000 by June 30, 2002.
4. Implement a program of individual and small group solicitations to increase the number of \$1,000 and above alumni contributors to at least 150 by June 30, 2002.

5. Secure at least 20 planned gifts by June 30, 2002.

6. Design and implement an aggressive plan for corporate and foundation solicitations to support the capital initiatives.

7. Establish a positive working relationship with the Alumni Association that results in increased financial and student recruitment support.

8. Enhance the alumni network centered around Homecoming and Founder's Day.

In the weeks and months ahead, there is a critical need for unity. We will be sustained by your readiness and willingness to cooperate as well as your financial support.

Lincoln University needs more donors to step up to the plate and make significant commitments to this venerable institution.

# President's Report to Board of Trustees: September 15, 2001

**2002-2003 Commonwealth Budget Request:** Lincoln's 2002-2003 Commonwealth Budget Request included a request for funding as shown below. The University has again requested funding for technology and sciences, in addition to those line items funded for fiscal year 2001-2002. We have also requested that the Program Initiatives appropriation be reclassified and consolidated with the Educational & General appropriation.

## Development and Fund-raising Activities

Development, fund-raising and community building activities and meetings remained high priorities throughout the summer months. Several contacts were made with alumni, friends and supporters, and regional organizations to continue to foster support and develop relationships that will prove mutually beneficial to the University and all those associated with it.

In addition to meeting with individual alumni, a meeting was held with the President of the Alumni Association to discuss ways in which the University administration and the Alumni Association can work together to achieve our mutual goals. A summary of "Selected Presidential Activities" is detailed at the end of this report.

## 3020 Market Street Study

During the 2000-01 academic year, a committee was appointed to conduct a study of the programs offered at the Urban Center in Philadelphia. The committee's findings were submitted to the Vice President for Academic Affairs, who, based on the findings, as well as a report from the Director of the Urban Center and relative information submitted by the office of fiscal affairs, compiled a report to the President entitled "Lincoln's Presence in Philadelphia." Based on this report, I have made a recommendation concerning Lincoln's continued presence in Philadelphia. We will continue discussions on how to make the facility more profitable.

## Capital Projects and Campus Infrastructure

Several capital projects were identified by the President's Cabinet and placed on a "Summer 2001 Priority Project List" to constitute the work order of jobs to be completed by the

Physical Plant department during the summer break and the first part of the fall 2001 semester. Many of the projects addressed the needs in residence halls and classroom buildings. Due in large part to the structure provided by the Priority List, our students arrived on campus to residence halls and classrooms which had undergone noticeable improvements and renovations. In addition, the complete internal renovation of Lucy Laney Hall, including the provision of new furniture and computer outlets, was finished on schedule and students were able to occupy the residence hall to start the fall semester.

The University has been in constant communication with the state government's Department of General Services in order to advance the process to enable work to begin on the capital projects falling within the scope of the \$29.4 million Commonwealth Appropriation. The parties are currently working to try to develop a master plan to coordinate the locations and scheduled construction of the projects.

The Director of Physical Plant and Vice President for Fiscal Affairs recently traveled to Harrisburg to meet with parties involved in the project. They are pleased with the attention given this matter and are confident that the process is moving forward.

## Faculty Contract Negotiations

Following many months of negotiations, the University was able to reach a contract agreement with the negotiating team of the Lincoln University Chapter-American Association of University Professors (LUC-AAUP). The faculty voted to ratify the negotiated Collective Bargaining Agreement for the period 2000-01, 2001-02, 2002-03. Details of the Agreement will be discussed further by the Business Affairs Committee of the Board and presented to the full Board for adoption.

## **Campus Security**

Effective July 1, 2001, a reorganized Lincoln University Security Office/Police force was established to provide safety and security services for the campus. Members of the reorganized force will be hired as Lincoln University employees. On July 11, 2001, Mr. Jansen M. Robinson, Director of Public Safety and Security, was granted full police powers in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by the Court of Common Pleas of Chester County. The security force will eventually include 12 campus police officers with full police powers, including the power to arrest, apply force and serve search warrants.

Officers/Police training was conducted for the security officers/police by the Chester County District Attorney's office, July 23-27, 2001. Additional training will be conducted in the fall and a refresher course will be offered in December. The University is confident that the reorganization of the department of safety and security will provide enhanced services in this area and help to address concerns expressed in the past by students, faculty and staff.

## **Strategic Planning**

Based on the University's recently adopted vision, mission, goals and philosophy statements, strategic plans specific to each area of operation are being developed by each of the vice presidents. The division plans will be compiled in a comprehen-

sive plan for the University. The goal is to distribute the comprehensive plan to the members of the Board before the scheduled November Board meeting.

## **Privatized Housing**

Lincoln is continuing to pursue the privatized housing project. The pool of contractors has been reduced to Century and College Park. Visits to sites developed by the two contractors still in contention for the project will be made at the end of September 2001.

## **Information Technology**

As the newly renovated Lucy Laney residence hall opened this semester, the University reached a new landmark in technology. The hall is the first residence hall to offer a personal "always-on" network connection to each individual resident. Each of the students residing in Lucy Laney may now browse the Internet, perform academic research and communicate with family and friends at full network speed while leaving the telephone in their room free.

At the same time, the network in the men's and women's wings of the Living Learning Center was completed, providing an "always on" full-speed network connection to each room. While this is not the same level of personal access available in Lucy Laney, it does provide connectivity to rooms housing 340 student residents.

## In Memorial

**Jackson Gusveller Glaze '50**, age 72, of Baltimore, Md., died Sept. 2, 2001. In 1965, Mr. Glaze was the first to open a medical lab, Precision Clinical Laboratory, to primarily serve Baltimore's Black community. His post-retirement volunteer work earned him the Roman Catholic Church's Black Hero Award in 1994 and the Mother Mary Lange Service Award in 2001. He served with the Army during the Korean War.

**Louis R. Purnell, Sr. '47**, age 81, of Washington, D.C., an original Tuskegee Airman, who attended Lincoln before entering the Air Force, died, Aug. 10, 2001. He flew 88 combat missions during WWII with the 99th Fighter Squadron and the 332nd Fighter Group and earned the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with eight Oak Leaf Clusters. He was a Smithsonian Institution curator for the National Air and Space Museum before he retired in 1985.
