## **Faculty Council Proposal Summary**

### Executive Summary in one paragraph

The By-Laws Committee was tasked with making changes to Faculty By-Laws to better reflect our university's new administrative structure. LU no longer has colleges, yet, needs alternative language to organize faculty into committees among other issues. We propose the use of the term "discipline." Moreover, we use the term School of Adult and Continuing Education (SACE) instead of graduate faculty in the By-Laws, in line with the new administrative structure.

#### **Exact Wording of the Proposed Motion**

Applying the above changes to Sections 4.01(b), 5.09(b, f, g, o, p, q, r, s, and u), 6.01, 6.03, 6.04, 6.06, 6.09, 7.01, 7.03, 7.04, 8.06(d and e), and 13.05 of the Faculty By-Laws: All instances of "college", if any, shall be changed to "discipline".

All instances of "graduate faculty", if any, shall be changed to "School of Adult & Continuing Education".

#### Who the proposal will affect and how

The By-Law changes will affect all faculty. It will specifically affect the academic departments or programs that used to be under a particular college but now are under a particular discipline. Eg. Dept. of Business & Entrepreneurial Studies and Dept. of Psychology & Human Services used to be part of PGE. They will now be part of the "Social Sciences & Business" Discipline. Moreover, the Political Science Program that used to be part of the History, Political Science, Philosophy & Religion Dept. along with four other humanities programs will now be a department under "Social Sciences & Business" discipline. These changes have been made so that programs/ departments are placed under the specific disciplinary category they belong.

#### Summary of Proposal's Critical Issues

The undergraduate faculty in the main campus will be organized under these three disciplines:

- 1. Arts & Humanities
- 2. Social Sciences & Business
- 3. Science & Technology

Our goal has been to align the Faculty By-Laws with the administrative changes introduced in 2018.
