Brenda A. Allen, President

Dr. Brenda A. Allen was named the 14th president of Lincoln University in Pennsylvania on May 11, 2017. She began her tenure on July 1.

From July, 2009 through June, 2017 she served as Provost and Vice Chancellor For Academic Affairs at Winston Salem State University (WSSU) where she was also a tenured member of the Faculty there, holding the title of Professor in the Department of Psychological Sciences. At WSSU, Dr. Allen's primary responsibility was to provide executive level leadership For the institution and for the overall coordination and effective implementation of the University's academic programs.

Dr. Allen departed WSSU with a legacy of achievements that include: leading the revision of the curriculum, overseeing the establishment of WSSU's first two doctoral programs, expanding undergraduate research funding, restructuring academic support to strengthen advising, creating an Office of Faculty Affairs, strengthening standards For tenure and promotion, and helping raise more than \$10 million For capital projects, scholarships and other student support.

Dr. Allen served as Associate Provost and Director of Institutional Diversity at Brown University before moving to WSSU. She was credited with helping to raise nearly \$15 million to support diversity goals, co-authoring a successful \$3.3 million NSF ADVANCE Grant, and leading efforts that culminated in 36% and 45% increases in the number of women and minority faculty members, respectively.

Prior to joining Brown University, Dr. Allen held a number of academic and administrative positions at Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts including full professorship, chair of the African American Studies Department, the Assistant to the President and Director of Institutional Diversity, and Special Assistant to the Provost.

Prior to her tenure at Smith College, Dr. Allen spent three years at Yale University where she held several positions, including Postdoctoral Associate in the Department of Psychology, and Lecturer in the Departments of Psychology and African American Studies.

Dr. Allen holds a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Lincoln University, a master's degree in Experimental Psychology and a doctorate in Developmental Psychology, both from Howard University in Washington, DC.
