An Ongoing Relationship with Princeton University





On Thursday, December 6th, and again on Wednesday, December 12th, department faculty met with the faculty of the Mathematics department at Princeton University to continue discussions of developing a complementary partnership. These discussions began back in October with a visit by Dr. Gabai, chair of the department of Mathematics at Princeton University. The group brainstormed several ideas for a partnership involving faculty and students from both departments. The department is excited at this partnership opportunity and eager to see where it leads us.

One promising suggestion from the brainstorming meeting was a "Path to a graduate program at Princeton" plan that would give undergraduate students here at Lincoln a course plan to prepare them for a graduate program in Astrophysics or Applied Mathematics and Computational Mathematics at Princeton after graduation. Such a program would offer our students more guidance and help them consider their post-graduation pursuits earlier. The group also discussed the potential for partnership through a faculty exchange program, whereby faculty from each university could spend a semester or year teaching and/or conducting research at the partner university. Such a program would open new opportunities for faculty development and collaborative research projects both here at Lincoln and at Princeton.
