

The dear old Orange and Blue



CLASS HISTORY

The class of 1980 burst upon the scene in August of 1976. We hit the campus full of stories of how great college was going to be. Mom and Dad weren't there to look over your shoulder, so now was the time to have fun. The first few hours of orientation week did nothing to change your feelings; you met a lot of people, got settled in your new room and found out that your roommate wasn't a complete bore. However, after the first couple of days of test, library orientation and Dean Vernon's motherly lectures about the sins of wearing curlers in your hair to class. The cafeteria food gave people serious doubts about the good college life.

Fortunately, the upperclassmen came back before you could really get too worried.

Then there were the debates about whether the Zetas, the A.K.A.'s, or the Deltas were the best and would you rather become an Alpha Angel, Kappa Sweetheart, Zeta Beau or an Omega Pearl. There were also the weekend parties, and occasionally between all this social activity you found time to go to a class or two.

The Homecoming weekend was now fast approaching. After getting over the shock that this was actually a Homecoming without a football game, it was time to settle down for more fun. Roy Ayers and Tavares were the entertainment that year, Man! Didn't we party all night long?

Shortly after Homecoming those mid-term grades came out. Some of us were scared to go home. The fall of 1977 saw a wiser class of 1980. Those of us who survived that first year sat back to lick our wounds and looked to see how many of our friends had fallen by the wayside. This year we vowed to have fun but not flunk out in the process.

But if we thought that the 1977-78 school year was going to be calm, we were wrong. The first day of class that year started with a professor being dragged out of his classroom by the police. One English class had two instructors. This was just the beginning of the fight between the administration and the faculty that got students caught in the crossfire.

Sophomore year was also the year when the cafeteria food began to deteriorate. Students were arrested for taking milk, juice, and other food out of the cafeteria. The C.S.L.U. (Concerned Students of Lincoln University) organized a trip to Harrisburg to lobby for the bill Lincoln needed to get its money. C.S.L.U. protested against students being arrested, the bad food, the health center and some professors. Demonstrations were planned for Homecoming to get the support of the Alumni. After Homecoming, sit-ins were staged in the S.U.B. to get some response from the Administration.

By spring there were faculty picket lines around Vail. Gerald Ford visited the campus. Secret Service agents stalked the campus like they owned it while Ford's entourage took over the top of the S.U.B. and the students were fed cold lunches in the lower level.

Junior year started off slower than the last two. The class of 1980 was nearing the home stretch. The size of the class had dwindled, but we were still holding on pretty strong. Things were fairly calm on campus; Homecoming came and went with Funkadelics providing the entertainment. The major mishaps were the window that got broken in the faculty dining room, and the fake fire drill in Hansberry. Rumors were flying fast and thick about fraternities and sororities. Second semester everyone was in for a rude shock! The business office announced that if your bill wasn't paid by January 31, then you would find yourself standing on Route 1 with your suitcases. A lot of people received ominous brown envelopes. Some people owed Lincoln as much as 5,000 dollars and most of the campus wondered how they managed to stay around so long. The campus seemed rather empty that semester; at least 100 people left because they didn't have the money.

The Board of Trustees sent another shock wave through campus by ending the 24-hour visitation and cutting visiting hours to 12 noon to 12 midnight, seven days a week. The campus ignored it; we were more discreet and business went on as usual. Late spring semester the Administration announced that Hansberry, Rendall, and McRary would become freshman dorms. Dean Vernon announced that there would be various improvements on Lincoln's campus (which no one believed), and that visitation hours would end at 9:30 P.M. for freshmen on weekdays, 11:00 P.M. for upperclassmen, and 12-2 during the weekends. Again, no one believed it would work.

With Floyd Green at the helm as S.G.A. President, the class of 1980 began its final days. James Love was elected president of the senior class and pledged to make this the best year ever and stressed class spirit. The major event for the senior class was Homecoming. It was planned to be a two night extravaganza, a jazz night with Dexter Wansel and Lonnie Liston Smith and a boogie night with Stephanie Mills and Skyy. There was a disco at the end of each of the concerts. Mavis Kelley was elected Homecoming queen. However, the excitement of Homecoming was overshadowed by the boycott of the convocation held as part of the Homecoming activities in which Siaka Stevens,

President of Sierra Leone, was to get an honorary degree. The student body staged a demonstration outside the chapel, while the ceremonies were carried on. The students carried picket signs and shouted, "Down with Branson, Savage, and Stevens." As the guest left, Lincoln ended up making the 6:00 news in Philadelphia and all the local papers. 
