- Resolved That any interference by any of the Powers of the world with this freedom or this exclusive jurisdiction, must be deemed an offence against humanity and an infraction of the international law.
- Resolved That the American Colonization Society be requested earnestly to press upon the Government of the United States the necessity of an early recognition of the independence of the Colonies of Liberia.
- Resolved That the American Colonization Society be requested to concert measures with the authorities of Liberia, by which on the application of the Agent appointed for that purpose in the Colonies, and sent duly accredited, a recognition of their independent position and territorial sovereignty may be obtained from some of the principal European Powers.

Mr Scott whilst intimating his ignorance of the general question — the old difficulties in Liberia — deprecated the return of Mr. Leys as calculated to renew the formations of parties and dissensions injurious to the Colony.

Mr Pinney recapitulated the proceedings at the meeting of the Board of Directors at Washington, held for the purpose of declaring the determination of the Board that Mr. Leys should never be allowed to return to Liberia without special permission of the American Colonization Society. A resolution to this effect would have been carried with only two dissenting voices, but for an implied pledge on the part of the leading members of the A. E. church that Mr. Leys should not be sent back.

Mr Pinney referred to documents in his possession to show the active interference of Mr. Leys in the political and civil government generally of Liberia, all provoking party

heat and disputes to the great injury of the colony

The testimony of some of the most intelligent
Members of the Methodist Episcopal church in Liberia
was cited in strong opposition to Mr. Sleys return.

Dr. M^r Dowall introduced a resolution in

The Delegates appointed to the Annual Meeting
of the American Colonization Society, to be held at Washington City,
the third Tuesday of January, met agreeably to appointment.
Present, the Rev C. C. Cuyler D.D. the Rev A. D. Gillett & Paul J. Jones.
The Evening of Tuesday was occupied, in attendance upon a public
Meeting held at the Capitol, at which several able and eloquent
addresses were delivered. The Meeting was adjourned over to Thursday.

Evening. The Board of Directors convened on Wednesday Morning at the rooms of the Society, Present Philad^e: delegation, Mr Andrew G. Phelps from the New York Society, Rev^e Joseph Tracy from the Mass^s Society, the Rev^e Mess^{rs} Davis & Garrison from District of Columbia, the Hon^e Mess^r Rivers & Wise of Virginia, the Hon^e Mess^r Huntington & Stewart of Connecticut, the Hon^e Mr Vance of Ohio and Elliott Cresson Esq of Philad^a, Life Director. The Rev John B Pinney, and Dr James Hall of the Maryland Society were invited to sit as corresponding Members. The Rev Dr Buylar was appointed President of the Board. The Members of the Executive Committee at Washington were present but not entitled to a vote. Mess^{rs} Mr. St. Clair Clarke, Ellsworth Dr Linsley Rev^e R.R. Gurley & Rev^e Mr McLain.

The Minutes of the previous year were read and approved. The Annual Report was committed to two Committees - the one touching the affairs and condition of the Colony - the second the home operations of the Society. The 1^o consisted of the Rev^e Joseph Tracy, Phelps & Gillett, 2^o of Mess^{rs} Cresson Jones & Garrison - The Treasurers report was committed to Mess^{rs} Jones & Phelps.

The report of the several Committees will appear in extenso, in the Annual report.

The case of the Rev^e Mr Seys was considered. Some members of the Board, desired, an explanation as to the cause and sanction of his return by the Missionary Board of his church. Some members of the Executive Committee stated, that as the result of the Conference, held in the city of Baltimore, touching this matter, it was understood, and promised upon the part of the Missionary

Board, that Mr. Seys should not return without the sanction of
of the Boards of Directors convening in Washington at this time.

The Rev^r Mr Davis a member of that church stated that
the instructions of Mr. Seys as given in the Christian Advocate, did
not countervail the understanding had at the Conference at Baltimore.

Mr. Seys was not sent as a Missionary to Liberia, but to Africa!
His instructions were, that if on landing at Monrovia, any opposition
or objections should be raised, to his residence in our Colony, he
was to repair forthwith to Cape Palmas, where the Maryland
Society has promised him their protection. Mr. Davis further
stated, that the Board of Managers of the Missionary Society at
New York were awaiting the action of the Board of Directors, in
order to despatch definite instructions to Mr. Seys. It was replied,
on behalf of the Executive Committee that they had written to
Governor Roberts on the subject and his answer must determine
any action on this subject. The whole matter was recommitted
to the Executive Committee, with full power to act in the premises.

The question was raised, by one of the Board, whether
a correspondence, had not taken place between the Secretary of
his Society, Mr. Gurley, and Mr. Seys respecting his anticipated
return.— Mr. Gurley stated that he had received a letter
from Mr. Seys, making enquiry as to the sailing of a vessel for
Liberia. The latter was couched in ~~a~~ Civil language, and
demanded a civil reply. A copy of this letter was required
and read as follows

Washington August 28th 1843

Rev^r Dear Sir

In reply to your favor of the 22nd,

I beg leave to say, that we are not expecting to despatch a vessel to Liberia, very soon, though I learn that the Annual expedition of the Maryland Society will sail from Baltimore on the 1st of November.

As you are about to renew your labours in the cause of Missions in Liberia, for which you have already made great sacrifices, I pray that a divine blessing may attend you. I feel assured, that your influence will be exerted to promote, peace, harmony, & good will among all sects and denominations in the Colony, and to unite all Christian hearts, more closely to each other and excite them to new endeavours to advance the Kingdom of our common and glorious Lord, —

Samuel Gladding of Providence R. I. will send a vessel to Liberia about the 10th of Sept^r next

On the morning of Friday it was proposed to go into an election for members of an Executive Committee. The chair appointed Messrs Phelps Gillettes & Davis

a Committee for nomination of Executive Committee. This Committee reported five names - Dr Lindsey's being omitted, his name was proposed to be added, as also Mr Dayton's the Commr. again retired, and reported, these with the others, making 7 names.

A question was then raised, whether the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer were members ex officio, and decided in the negatives. Then Mr Rives made a motion to lay the report of the Committee on Nominations on the table and proceed to the election of Corresponding Secretary which was adopted.

Mr Gurley was elected he having six votes and the Rev^o Mr McLain four.

The Report of the nominating Committee was then taken up, and the Board proceeded to the election of an Executive Committee. The Constitution fixes the number at seven, the last Committee were composed of 5 names which with the Rev^o Mr Gurley & McLain made the Constitutional number. The Committee reported 7 names excluding the two last named, Mr Gurley arose and warmly opposed any such innovation. He considered it indispensably necessary to the well being of the Society, that whoever else might be left off, the Corresponding Secretary should not be.

The report of the Committee was adopted, whereupon Mr Gurley arose, and tendered his resignation as Corresponding Secretary. On Motion of Mr Phelps his resignation was accepted. An election was then had for a successor, when Mr McLain was unanimously chosen.

The Expenses of the Society at Washington were graduated as follows. Secretary \$1,500 - Offices Rent \$200, Incidental Expenses \$300. The Board after prayer by Mr Davis adjourned.

(Dr Cuyler made some further remarks and explanations on the same subject)

Mr Pinney followed with some remarks. When it was Resolved, That the report of the Delegates be accepted.

Gentlemen.

I received

Philadelphia April 10. 1849

on the 22nd of March, a letter, signed William Doppinger, Clerk, transmitting to me a copy of certain resolutions presented to your Board at its meeting of March 13th; and which were laid over for future consideration.

These resolutions, three in number, while they direct me, as Editor of the Colonization Herald, what to do, in the circumstances specified, for the future, contain, also, an implied censure on me for the past, as if the matters to be reformed had grown into a regular habit.

The first resolution calls for the publication of the Herald, on or before the first of each month.

To this I would reply, that it is now published, as nearly as may be, about the middle of the month - an arrangement which in no manner interferes with the regular supply and desired variety of topics for the benefit of the readers of the paper, at the same time that it is more convenient for the Editor, in reference to his other engagements.

The second resolution requires that articles relating to the Colonization cause, shall have a precedence of other matters.

On this I would remark, that a reference to the columns of the Colonization Herald, from Month to Month will show that such a precedence has been

uniformly given, both as regards the proportion of Colonization matter, and the prominence allotted to it by editorial commendation.

Piles of selected articles for the miscellaneous department on the fourth page have accumulated every few months without my being able to give them place. No such accumulation is allowed of articles on Colonization. Sometimes, it must happen that the columns of the paper will not contain all the matter of this kind on hand; and a portion is postponed until the following month.

Resolution third recommends to refrain from using the language of Abolitionism - as its phraseology is hateful to the South, and its adoption by us is calculated to estrange our friends from the good cause - .

I may say, on this subject, that the Editor of the Colonization Herald has never manifested any sympathy or affinity for certain tenets of Abolitionism - its intemperance, its injustice under the plea of justice and its tyranny, while professing to advocate freedom. As to the language of Abolitionism, it varies with the theme; being sometimes in its better strains, such as every humane person would readily select for giving utterance to his pity for the enslaved, and his desire to ameliorate their condition, and to procure for them the enjoyment of freedom. These feelings may sometimes be breathed in accents of mingled

Benevolence and poetry, without consistent Colonizationists daring to disavow, even if they had been afraid to express them in the like terms. That minute censorship which would expunge from our current literature all the language and incidental remarks of Abolitionism, on the right of man and the evils of slavery, occurring in history, biography and critical disquisitions and essays, is not such as will ever be tolerated by Pennsylvania Friends. Are we to forego our privileges of free thought and speech because we are Colonizationists? The intelligent and truly benevolent men of the South, they whom we might hope to make our friends, cannot look with favour on the emasculation of our language and a mean compliance with the embittered prejudices of their more tyranical neighbours, whom nothing can satisfy short of our entire silence respecting their cherished institution.

I make these remarks on the resolutions, out of respect to the Board of Managers before whom they were offered - at the same time I must add, that said resolutions are irrelevant, without a colour of necessity and manifest a spirit of individual dictation to which under no circumstances will I submit. Although I have no fears of their being adopted by you, nor of any breach in the harmony which has for so many years existed between the Board and myself as Editor.

of the Colonization Herald, yet I must place myself beyond the reach of similar annoyances for the future by any member whose zeal outruns his discretion. I accordingly, resign the office of editor of the Colonization Herald with which I have been so long, and at different periods, honoured, - without solicitation or the expression of any wish on my part - to receive the appointment - my professional and literary interests have suffered by retaining it; both will be benefitted by my giving it up.

In withdrawing from the discharge of such responsible ^{duties} as have so long devolved on me, in connexion with Colonization, I cannot forbear from avowing my uninterrupted regard for this great and good cause, which I have steadily and fearlessly, and to the best of my ability and judgement, advocated and shall continue still, though in a necessarily more circumscribed range, to advocate.

On motion it was

Resolved That the salary of William Copperger as Clerk of this Board be increased One Hundred Dollars - \$100- per annum from 1st inst.

The President stated that in consequence of the time of service of the late Board being about to expire, the Committee appointed at the last meeting on the publication of the Colonization Herald had not met to consider the subject.

Mr Jones presented the following preamble and resolutions respecting the Colonization Herald, which, after some discussion, were duly adopted.

Whereas In the progress of African Colonization, the good cause has grown steadily from the weakness of infancy, to the size and vigour of Manhood, so, that of late, we have witnessed Colonial dependence, give place to National Independence.

And

Whereas In advocacy of this great enterprise of benevolence in our Country, it is necessary that all the auxiliary

Societies should concentrate their influence in favor of the American Colonization Society at Washington, not only by the contribution of funds, but the power of the press, speaking through a Central National Organ. And

Whereas This Society in the publication of its Journal, can expect and does receive, but a very limited patronage beyond our own State, while our desire is, to expand our geographical limits, so as to embrace every portion of the Country. Therefore

Resolved That the publication of the Colonization Herald be dispensed with.

Resolved That a Committee be appointed to confer with the Parent Society, as well as the several Auxiliary Societies, in order to devise and execute a plan for establishing and sustaining an efficient paper, at Washington, D.C.
On motion

Resolved, That said Committee consist of three; whereupon, Messrs Jones, Durbin and Davidson were appointed.

Resolved That the paying subscribers to the Colonization Herald be supplied with the African Repository - and if a satisfactory arrangement can be made for the publication of a central Organ, that our subscription list be transferred to it.

The minutes of the last meeting were read & approved.

Mr Jones from the Committee on proposed publica-
tion of a Colonization newspaper at Washington City,
made a report, which was received and ordered to be
filed.

The following resolutions offered by Mr Cresson were
adopted; viz,

Resolved That the pledges given by this Society in 1839 to our
protégés at Bassa Dove on the relinquishment to the
American Colonization Society of our separate organization,
and the appeals they now make to us for aid to sustain
their present position and to avail themselves of their
great local advantages, call upon us to redeem the
promises then given; therefore

Resolved That while we rejoice in every opportunity of promoting
the general objects of the American Colonization Society,
yet we deem it an imperative duty to apply the
means placed at our disposal towards the settlement
at Bassa Dove of additional emigrants to enable

them to develop their resources, occupy their now deserted harbour, and strengthen themselves against the hostility of their faithless neighbours, the Fishermen.

Resolved That to the extent of its disposable funds, this Society pledges the sum of Fifty Dollars for each able bodied emigrant, and the same amount for each member of his family, to be paid to the American Colonization Society whenever this Society shall be duly apprized of their comfortable settlement, within the limits of Bassa County.

Letters from Rev Edward H. May, dated Columbia, October 23rd and 31st and Chambersburg, November 6th 1849, were presented.

The Minutes of the meeting were then read, when the Board, on motion

The following communication from the Executive

swer to the resolutions of our last meeting, was

directed to be entered at length on the minutes.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the American Colonization Society, held on the 14th inst., the Resolutions adopted by the Board of Managers of the Pennsylvania Colonization Society at their meeting on the 13th November, having been under consideration, the following address to the said Board of Managers was adopted, to wit:

To the Board of Managers

of the Penn. Colonization Society,

Gentlemen,

We have received and duly considered the Resolutions which you adopted at your meeting on Tuesday the 13th November, and forwarded to us in a letter of your Secretary, of the 19th ultimo.

We beg leave to suggest for your consideration the following facts.

At the last Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Am: Col'g'n Society, a resolution was adopted, instructing us to receive all suitable applicants for a passage to Liberia, and give them a free passage; and, in connexion with this another resolution was also adopted, recommending the State Societies to make more vigorous efforts to raise funds and transmit them to the Treasurer of the Parent Society, to aid in defraying

the expenses incurred in sending emigrants to Liberia.

In the course of remarks made by the Delegates, particularly those present from Pennsylvania, pledges were given that the best exertions of your Society should be put forth to raise funds which should at once be placed at our disposal. Being thus assured that you stood firmly by us, we went forward according to the order of the Board, until we had sent 422 emigrants to Liberia. We thereby incurred a large debt which is not yet paid. We have been compelled to borrow money to save the credit of the Society, and we are yet paying interest thereon.

To enable us to meet these engagements, we had been encouraged to expect a remittance from you about the same time that your resolutions of the 13th ultimo were received. You may therefore imagine our great disappointment. For if we rightly understand your actions, touching the appropriation of your funds, the money now, or rather then, in your Treasury, must remain there useless, until you are "duly apprized of the comfortable settlement within the limits of Bassa County," of emigrants yet to be found and sent out. We do not consider emigrants comfortably settled, until they have been there six months, have had the fever and recovered, have drawn their funds, and are living on them. We presume this is your understanding of the same. No vessel will leave the

United States with emigrants before the Siberia Packet, which is now daily expected, and we hope will sail again soon after the close of this year. She will land her emigrants, say about February 15, so that by the middle of August, 1850, they will be in the situation required by your resolution, and as soon thereafter as we can hear that they are alive and well, we can receive the \$50 each, which you pledge, to the extent of your "available funds".

Doubtless it did not occur to you when you adopted the resolution, that the funds then in your Treasury would have to lie there for eight months before they could be of any avail to the great cause for which they were contributed!

Under these circumstances we would respectfully suggest whether it is doing justice to the common patrons of the Colonization cause for us to be paying interest on money borrowed, to meet our engagements, while there are funds lying idle, locked up in another branch of the Treasury, contributed for this very purpose!

There seems in our judgment, to be some want of conformity in the spirit of your action with that adopted by the last Board of Directors.

In our opinion the Parent Society and the several State Societies, form one grand interest and organization, in which there is no distinction or separate ends to be

served. We are the appointed Agency for executing the will of the several State Auxiliary Societies as expressed by them in their organized capacity of a Board of Directors.

We are aware that there has been expressed to you some dissatisfaction with our management of the affairs of the Society as respects the sending of emigrants to Bassa County. This subject was brought up at the last meeting of the Board of Directors, and the facts and correspondence and records, were all brought out and your delegates then present expressed themselves as satisfied therewith.

It was then made apparent, that of the whole number of emigrants sent out during the last few years, Bassa had received her full proportion, as will appear from the annexed statement taken from the records. Since that date, the emigrants whom we have sent, had all kindly living in some of the other settlements to whom they wanted to go. We therefore could not with any propriety send them against their will to Bassa. But long before the receipt of your resolutions, we had been making preparations to send the next Company of about 150 by the Packet to Bassa, with the exception of two or three families of them, who have relatives in the other settlements. This will give to Bassa more than her due proportion of the emigrants sent out in 1849.

It is also true, that during these said last few

years, we have expended in Bassa County more money than we have received from your Society during the same periods. We are ready to continue the same policy. We feel as deep an interest in Bassa as we do in any other settlement, and it is our interest to build it up as fast as possible. Liberia must stand or fall by the Union and prosperity, or the reverse, of all its parts. We are of opinion that you ought to feel the same interest in the other settlements that you do in Bassa. The cause is one - the Colony is one - and there ought to be for its advancement a perfect concentration of interest and funds.

We should be and should feel ourselves to be, unworthy of the trust reposed in us by the Board of Directors, were we to adopt any narrow or limited policy in the location of emigrants, or show any degree of favoritism therein. It will take about \$8000 comfortably to settle in Grand Bassa County the Company we are about to send there. If you adhere to your resolution to appropriate your funds to Bassa, it may become necessary for us to appropriate the funds at our control to the benefit of the other settlements in Liberia. In this light it may become necessary for us to change the destination of the Company shortly to sail in the Packet.

We would therefore most respectfully suggest to

you the importance of a return to the policy approved by the last Board of Directors; and in order thereto, that you would repeal the resolutions of the 13th ult:, and let us move on in the same delightful harmony which has marked our past history.

We have thought it expedient that our Secretary, Rev: William Mc Sain, should attend your meeting on the 11th inst, in order that he may give any explanations necessary, and state more fully the present position of our affairs, and the urgency of our want of funds to carry out our engagements. Mr McLain then made some remarks, - that the Am: Colonization Society was about \$12.000 in debt and that it would require \$7.500 more to send out the emigrants now offering - 150 in number - .

The correspondence between the Corresponding Secretary under date of November 19th and 28th, and Rev: Mr McLain, dated November 19th and 21st were also read. Whereupon the following resolutions were unanimously adopted.

Resolved That this Board has heard with great pleasure from the address of the Executive Committee of the Am: Colonization Society under date of the 8th inst, that they intend sending the emigrants by their next expedition to Bassa Dove, under circumstances calculated to secure their comfortable settlement there: therefore

Resolved That to aid in this grateful result, our Treasurer transmit the sum of \$1.000 to the American Colonization Society at Washington, and that an order be drawn for the amount.

Resolved That a Committee of two be appointed to wait on Mr McLain and apprise him of the passage of these resolutions. Messrs Fouke and Jones were appointed the Committee.

Mr Jones offered his resignation as Man-

table.

Resolved That the Corresponding Secretary be requested
to reply to the Address of the Executive Commit-
tee, American Colonization Society, and inform
them of our action thereon.
