
Giving From Your Retirement Plan

Your IRA can be taxed up to 70% if passed on to heirs, but there is no tax when it is used to make a charitable gift to Lincoln University.



How It Works

- Name or designate Lincoln University as a beneficiary of your IRA, 401(k), or other qualified retirement plan.
- Leave your assets to your heirs, your IRA to Lincoln University and nothing to the IRS.
- Important! Please tell Lincoln University about your gift. Your plan administrator is not obligated to notify us. So if you don't tell us, we may not know to honor you for your gift.

Benefits

- · Continue to take regular lifetime withdrawals.
- Maintain flexibility to change beneficiaries if your family's needs change during your lifetime.
- Your heirs avoid double taxation and may receive an estate tax deduction.
